MARICOPANURSING RN Program

- Four-semester nursing program: Blocks 1-4
 - Block 1: Nursing fundamentals
 - Block 2: Medical/surgical nursing, psychiatric nursing
 - Block 3: Medical/surgical nursing, obstetric nursing
 - Block 4: Complex care nursing, pediatric nursing; capstone
- Includes full-time day and full-time evening/weekend options
- Clinical experiences provided in variety of agencies throughout the Valley
- On completion students are awarded Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing degree
- Eligible to take NCLEX-RN to be licensed as a Registered Nurse (RN) after completion of AAS

What is the AAS/BSN Concurrent Enrollment Program?

1. Student completes all pre-requisite and co-requisite courses for MaricopaNursing AAS and for partner university
2. Application and acceptance to CEP
3. Concurrent completion of MaricopaNursing AAS courses and partner university BSN (or MSN** bridge) courses
4. Graduate with AAS and BSN!*

**BSN completion either concurrent with AAS completion or within 1-2 semesters following AAS completion if recommended program of study followed .*

***MSN bridge courses are taken during the AAS program; MSN completion at GCU follows*

CEP Eligibility

Admission Criteria:

- Acceptance into MaricopaNursing pool (*Nurse Assistant course or certification/licensure required for application*)
- Nursing admission test: HESI A2
- Completion of pre- and co-requisite course requirements for MaricopaNursing and partner university*
- Meet GPA requirement for university partner (check with university partner for courses used for GPA calculation)
- Meet MaricopaNursing health and safety requirements
 - Will include supplemental background check, drug screening (time specified by program) and DPS Level 1 Fingerprint Clearance Card

**Some university partners will accept pending applications with 7 or fewer credits pending – university pre-requisites only, please check with the university advisor. All MaricopaNursing pre and co-requisite courses must be completed prior to application.*

If You Have A Bachelor's Degree

Grand Canyon University (GCU) AAS to MSN pathway

- Entrance requirements:
 - Previous bachelor's degree is required
 - Meet a minimum GPA of 2.5 to enter the CEP courses listed with an Asterisk *.
- Students complete six “bridge” courses (18 credits) with **Grand Canyon University** during the blocks of the MaricopaNursing program
 - Significantly reduced tuition for bridge courses (\$250 per credit hour)
- Within 60 days after graduation from MaricopaNursing – Next steps
 - Pass NCLEX
 - Meet a minimum GPA of 3.0 to enter the MSN portion of the program
 - Take practicum/professional capstone course
 - Begin one of the following MSN Specializations:
 - Health Informatics
 - Education
 - Leadership in Health Care Systems
 - Public Health
 - Healthcare Quality and Patient Safety
 - 6 courses (21 credits)

CEP Financial Considerations

- Maricopa Nursing cost per credit hour \$85.00*
 - Textbooks, course fees, and supplies are additional
 - Out-of-state tuition rates may apply – check with the Admissions department at the college**
- Financial aid may be available but is affected by many factors
 - Number of hours of undergraduate credit
 - Previous degree
 - Full-time/part-time status
 - Consortium agreement with university

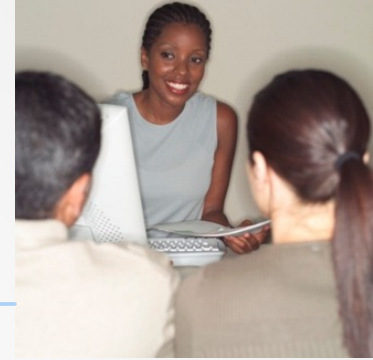

How Do I Apply for the CEP?

CEP application process:

- Carefully review all options to determine desired MaricopaNursing campus sites and university partner – only select MaricopaNursing campus locations you will be willing to attend
- Complete the CEP application online (electronic form coming soon)
- Submit to MaricopaNursing advisor at your Maricopa college of first choice
 - Completed CEP application and signed Information Declaration
 - All unofficial transcripts (for transcript evaluation from outside of Maricopa, this process may take up to 6 weeks, so please get these submitted as early as possible)
 - HESI A2 scores
- **Applications accepted (dates will vary slightly so check the website):**
 - December 1/February 1 Summer university start, fall Block 1 start
 - April 1/June 1 Fall university start, spring Block 1 start



CEP Selection Process

- Applications are scored using rubric per program admission criteria:
 - GPA
 - HESI A2 scores
 - Previous degree
 - Previous nursing school failure (point deduction)
- All CEP applicants receive official Maricopa email notification of placement determination from MaricopaNursing college where accepted*:
 - Admission (if pending NAU coursework, all pending courses must be successfully completed prior to admission and meet overall GPA requirements)
 - Denial
- In rare case of a “tie,” MaricopaNursing application date and time stamp is used to determine placement

CEP Rubric 100 total points possible

Here's how the rubric points are calculated:

- GPA* – calculated GPA, multiply by 10 (40% of total rubric score)
- HESI English Composite score – multiply by 0.35 (35% of total rubric score)
- HESI Math score – multiply by 0.15 (15% of total rubric score)
- Previous degree points – 2.5 for Associate's, 5.0 for Bachelor's, 7.5 for Master's, 10 for Doctoral – up to a maximum of 10 possible points (10% of total rubric score)
- There will be a deduction of 5 points for a previous nursing program failure or “withdrawal failing” grade

**GPA calculation varies by university; see website and/or nursing advisor for additional information*

Rubric Example

- GPA is $3.4 \times 10 = 34$ points
- HESI English composite score is $85.33 \times 0.35 = 29.87$ points
- HESI Math score is $92 \times 0.15 = 13.8$ points
- Student has a previous AAS = 2.5 points; BA = 2.5 = 5 points
- No previous nursing school failures/withdrawal failing

Total rubric points = 82.67

CEP Admission

- Students will be placed at desired Maricopa college and cohort whenever possible, but first choice placement is **not** guaranteed. If you will only accept placement at **ONE** Maricopa college, only indicate that school as a choice
- Students not chosen for admission will not lose time/date stamp for MaricopaNursing pool and remain eligible for non-CEP admission
- Number of CEP seats available is dependent on semester, capacity at MaricopaNursing colleges, and number of applicants
- Students may receive a letter from the university stating student has been accepted into the university – this does **not** imply nor promise CEP acceptance at MaricopaNursing
- Students not selected for CEP admission are encouraged to reapply with a new CEP application during the next intake period
